A Capacity Building Approach to Training

Build your own skill and your organization's capacity a step at a time as you gain experience with each training module. Have the support of trainers and your peers between trainings with practitioner development seminars.

The well-rounded practitioner uses more than one model and is able to adapt to address a variety of situations. Large organizations and institutions benefit from having advanced practitioners in house.

Thinking Restoratively: Foundations for Understanding

This experiential training establishes a foundation of understanding of the philosophy, principles, and practices that underpin restorative justice and restorative practices. For anyone interested in using or supporting the practices.

Speaking Restoratively: The Practice of Restorative Inquiry

Learn to use affective statements and restorative questions in informal interventions. These are critical skills for practitioners who want to become facilitators, as well as others who want to understand and support restorative practices within an organizational setting.

Restorative Conference Practitioner

Learn to use this structured and more formal model involving the use of a script based on restorative inquiry. It is commonly used in response to a specific incident of harm.

Restorative Circle Practitioner

Circle process is used both proactively to build community and deliver curriculum, and as a response to conflict or harm. Learn when and how to facilitate a successful circle for a variety of purposes.

Restorative Mediation Practitioner

Cases involving serious harm or where issues are very complex, entrenched, or sensitive can require greater skill on the part of the facilitator in designing and carrying out a restorative process.

32 hrs. pre-requisite: Conference or Circle

Restorative Practices Trainer

Experienced practitioners may provide training within their organization to expand its capacities. Involves advanced training and co-facilitation.

pre-requisite: one year active experience in one or more practices.

Restorative Practitioner Development Seminars

Following practitioner training, join other trainees in bi-weekly small group online seminars. Convened by a trainer who provides additional content and facilitates peer learning. Included as part of training.
